## How Do Companies Enjoy FTA Privileges

- 1 Obtain FTA information on the country which you plan to export.
- 2 Define your product Harmonised System (HS) Code from the Royal Malaysian Customs Department ([www.kastam.gov.my](http://www.kastam.gov.my)).
- 3 Check whether the product is included in tariff concessions under FTA through the Ministry of International Trade and Industry (MITI) website
- 4 Check whether the products meet the Rules of Origin (ROO) criteria by submitting the Cost Analysis (CA) Report.
