







How Do Companies Enjoy FTA Privileges

- Obtain FTA information on the country which you plan to export.
- Define your product Harmonised System (HS) Code from the Royal Malaysian Customs Department (www.kastam.gov.my).
- Check whether the product is included in tariff concessions under FTA through the Ministry of International Trade and Industry (MITI) website
- Check whether the products meet the Rules of Origin (ROO) criteria by submitting the Cost Analysis (CA) Report.
